Practicum Log		Ungraded but MUST be completed and handed in in order to document 22 – 25 hours spent in the practicum.
Practicum assignments	20%	Assignments completed in conjunction with practicum activities. Participation in on-line discussions through WebCT (minimum of 5 meaningful entries)
Lesson plan and critique	20%	A lesson developed and implemented by you , and a critique of the lesson.
Seminar 1 – Practicum observation and reflection	15%	A seminar in which you present observations from your practicum and interactively reflect on the issues or interests generated through the observations.
Seminar 2 – Book or article review	20%	A seminar in which you present the content of a book or article and interactively discuss how you would use the findings in your practicum.
Exam	25%	In last class. Covers content from lectures and associated readings
